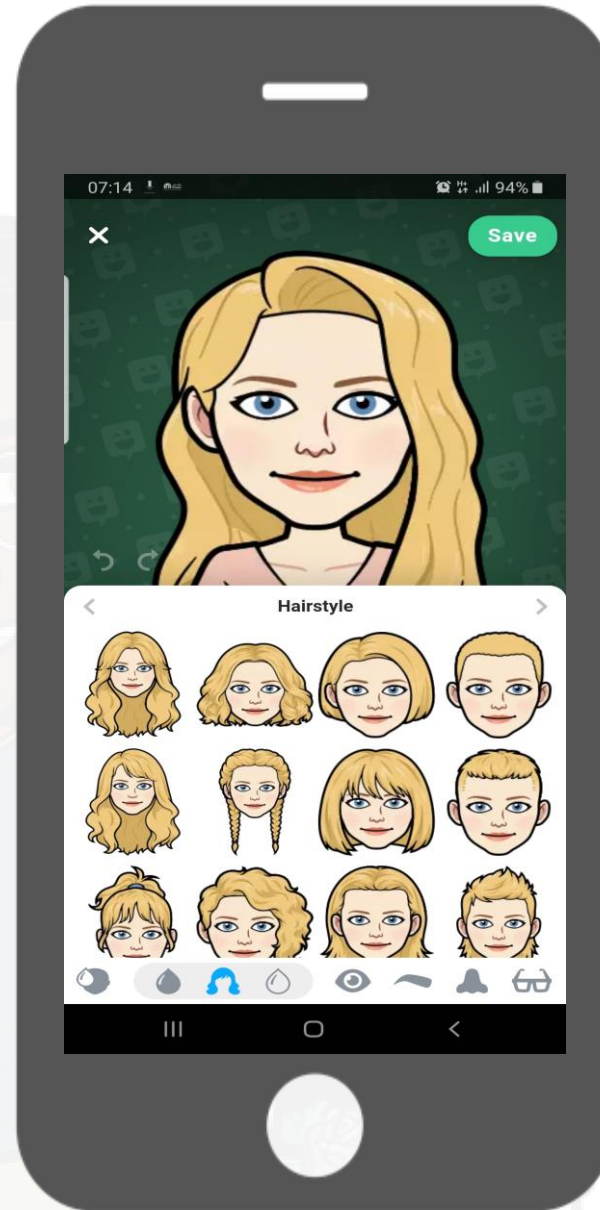


# How to create an interactive Bitmoji classroom and embed it in Teams

Step 1 – download the Bitmoji app on your phone and register your email and password. Then have fun designing your avatar!



Step 2 – log into Bitmoji.com on Google Chrome and scroll down to add the extension.

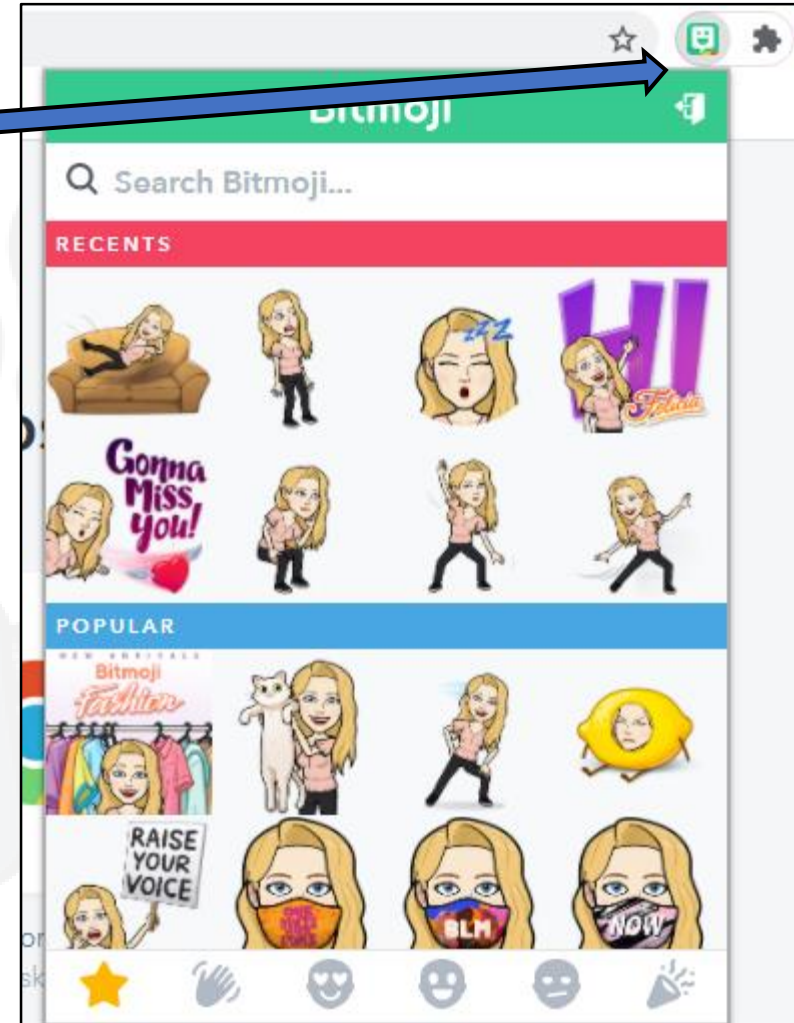

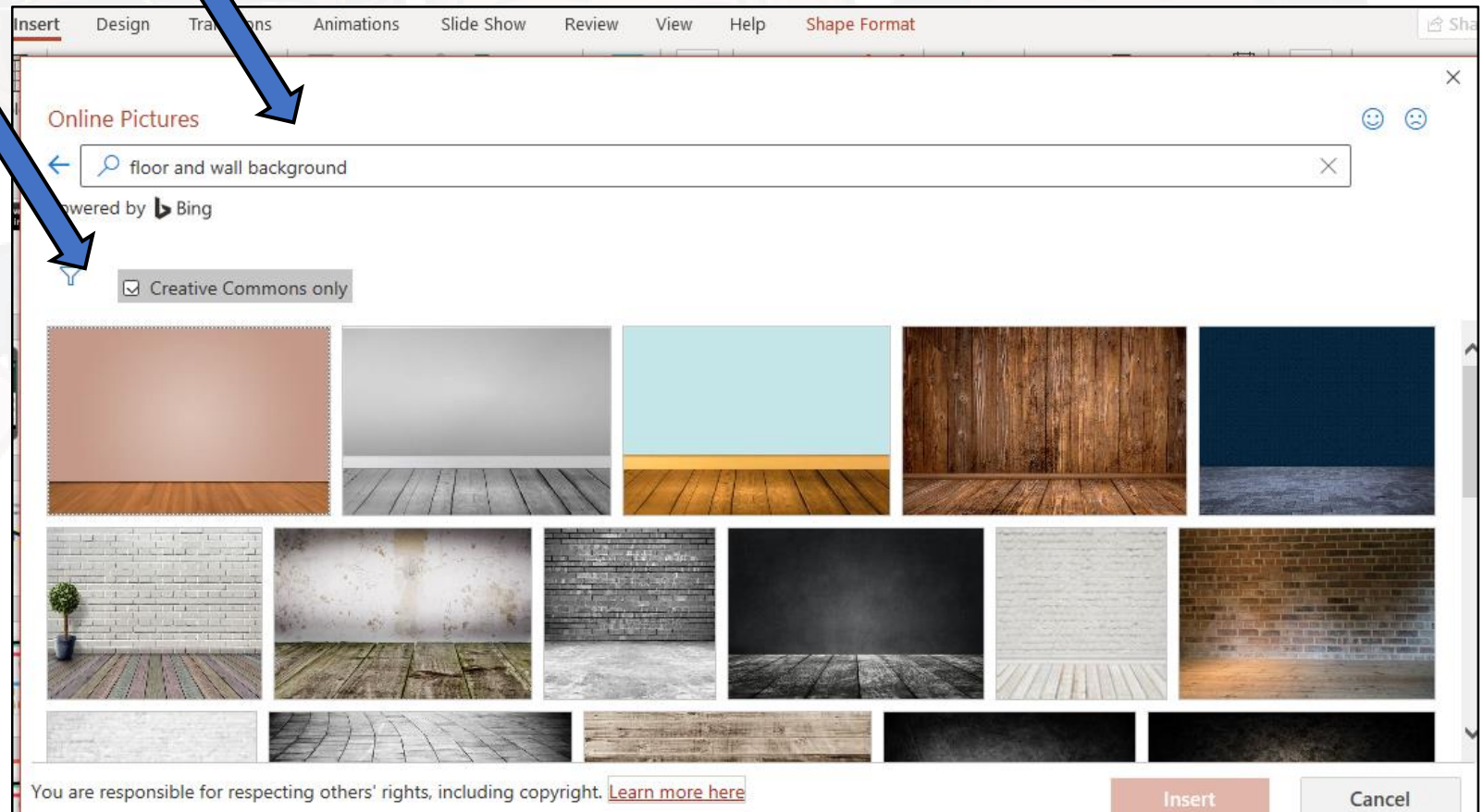

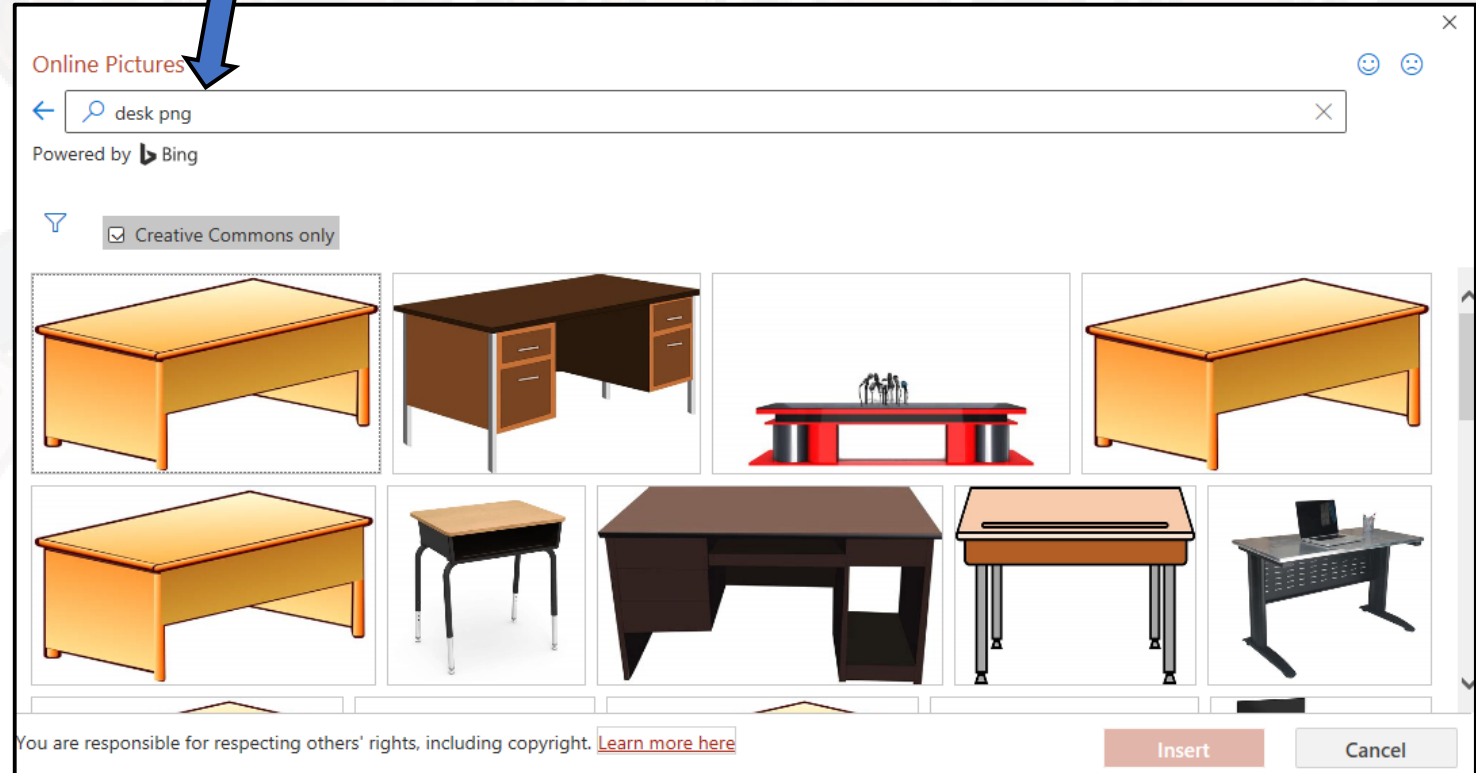
Step 3 – click the puzzle piece icon at the right-hand side of the Google Chrome screen. You can download and save images of your Bitmoji avatar.



Step 4 – open PowerPoint and click on ‘insert’ then ‘online pictures’. Type ‘floor and wall background’ and click the box labelled ‘creative commons only’.



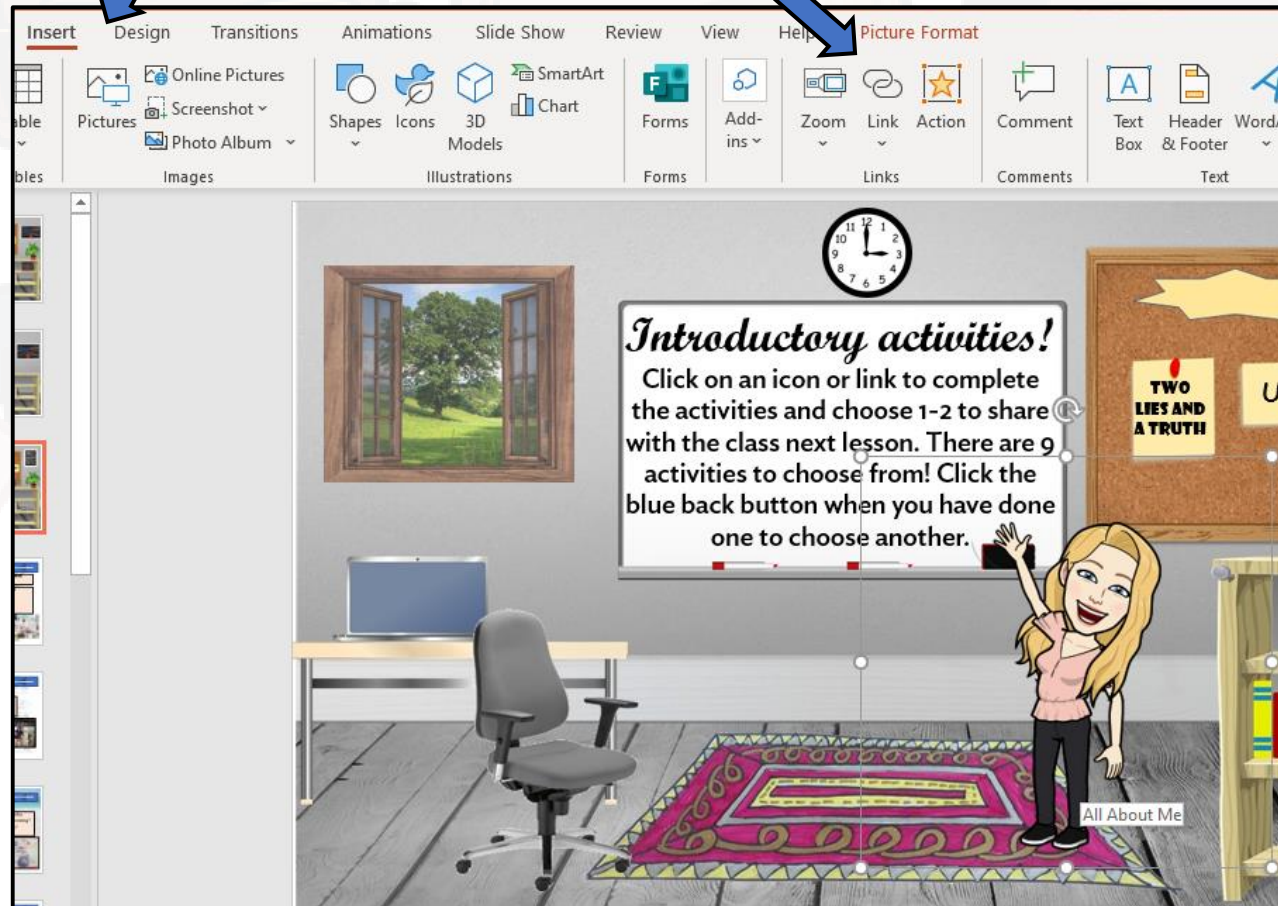
Step 5 – decorate your classroom using the ‘online pictures’ or your own images. Remember to type ‘PNG’ after your search item to ensure you search for transparent pictures.



Step 6 – when you have the basic classroom decorated, add your Bitmoji and save your PowerPoint slide as a JPEG template. When you insert the JPEG into a new slide, you can start adding links to make your classroom interactive.

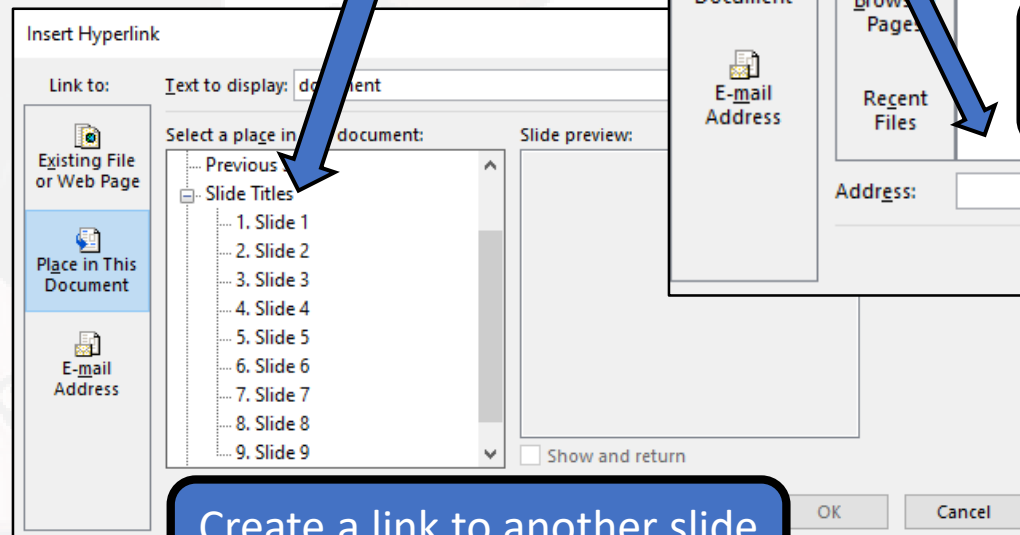


Step 7 – click on the object or text you want to link to and click ‘insert’ then ‘link’. Alternatively, right click on the object and click link.

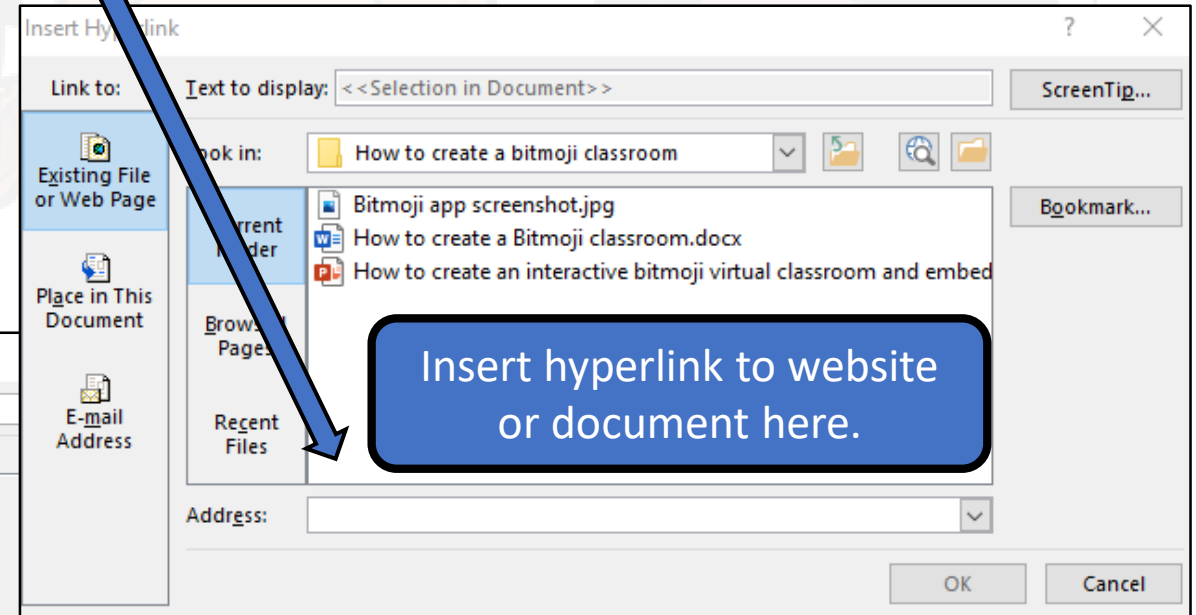




Step 8 – you can link to another slide, a document (if the document is set to share with anyone with a link or public) or a website.

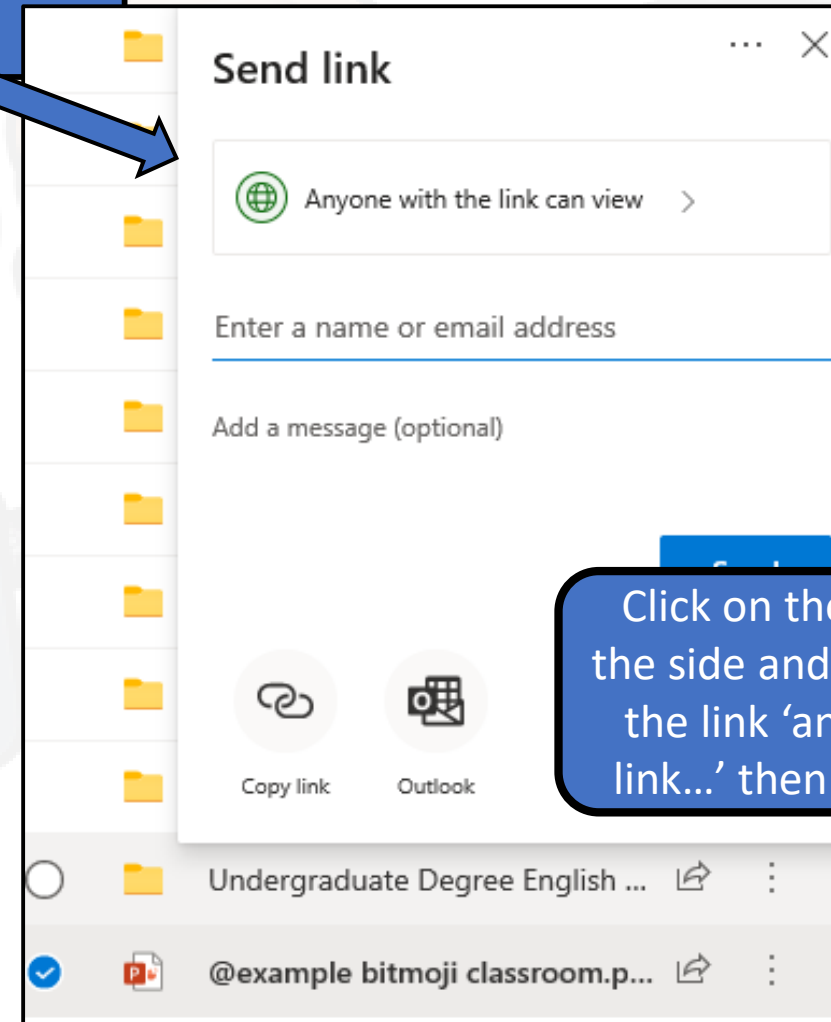

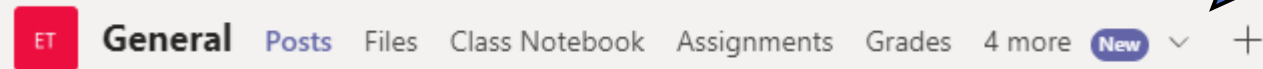

Step 9 – when you have finished your interactive lesson and created all your links, save the PowerPoint to your OneDrive with an ‘anyone with the link can view’ link.



Click on the three dots at the side and ‘share’ to make the link ‘anyone with the link...’ then click copy link.

Step 10 – open Teams to the class team you want to add the interactive classroom. Click on the + sign at the top.



Step 11 – search ‘website’ and click the website icon when it comes up.




Step 12 – paste the link to your PowerPoint from your OneDrive in 'URL'.

You can choose whether to post about your class to the Teams.

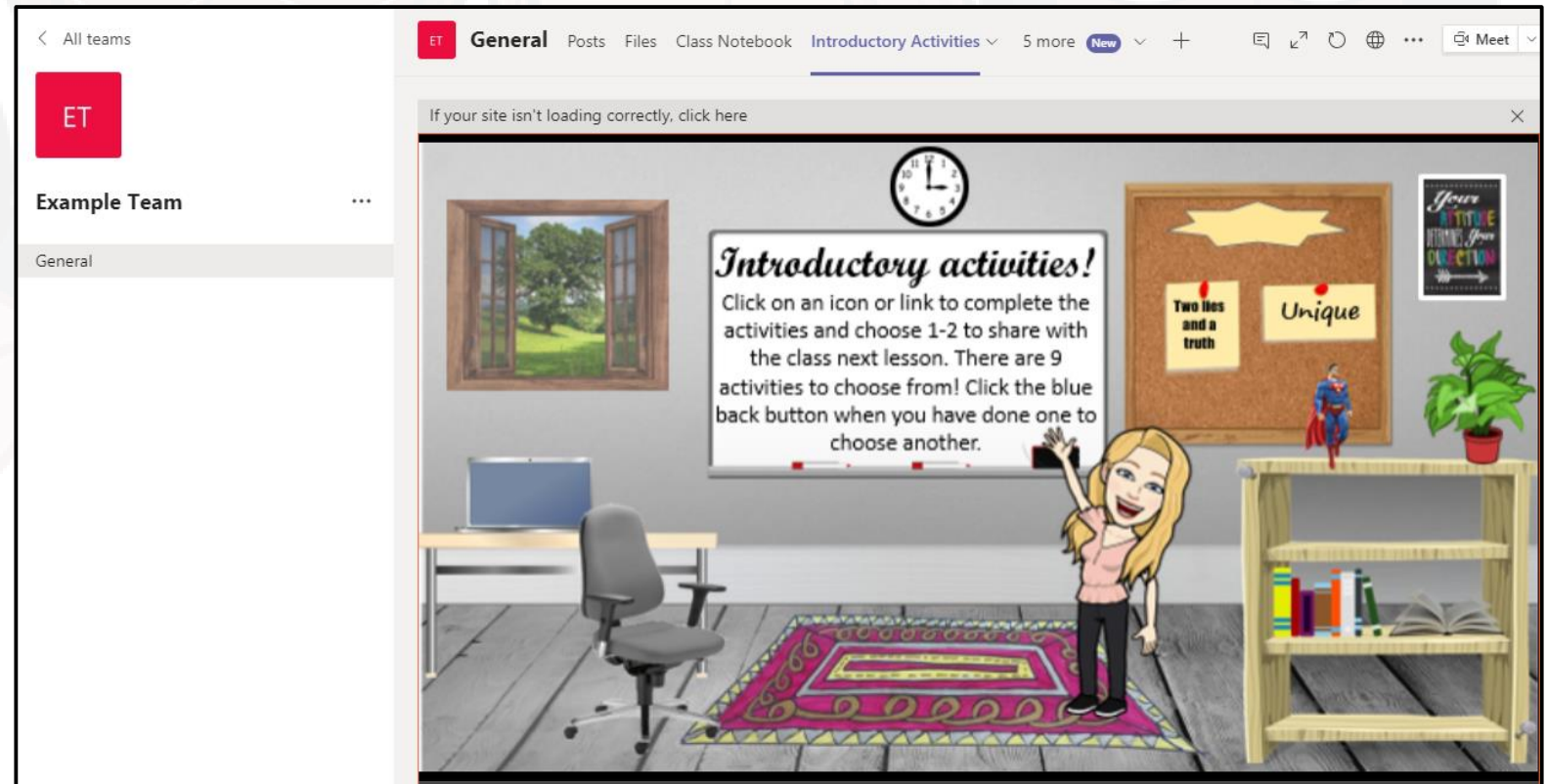
Step 13 – scroll to the end of the link and type `&amp;= &action=embedview` before you save.

Step 14 – you should have an interactive classroom embedded in your Team. Students will be able to click the link but will not be able to download or edit the document.
